





Performer, Director, Dramaturge, Creative Producer & Founder of Theatre ENTROPIA / Greece

Founder of Theatre ENTROPIA, and Artistic Director of the homonymous Contemporary Performing Arts Com- pany and of the International Multidisciplinary "Alternative Stage Festival (F.E.S., 2003–2008)". As an actress has participated in theatre and live-art performances, films and TV productions in Greece and abroad. She's the director and author of several theatre performances, interdisciplinary productions and international projects, amongst others: Letherface by Helmut Krausser, Faust is Dead by Mark Ravenhill, The Free Besieged by Dionyssios Solomos, Go Go Go by Juliana Francis, Manifesto 2083 by Christian Lollike, Projekt RAF, Genocide, CUT Project/DE-FENCES, P.I.G.S./Sotiria, Occupy Fantasy!, Camp Europe. Her practice includes also writing, curating, translating, lecturing and instructing seminars and workshops on performance, cultural policies and artivism.



SUSANNE DANIG

Director of BIRCA & Danig Performing Arts Service / Denmark

Owner of the Danig Performing Arts Service and the residency center BIRCA at Bornholm. Previously direc- tor of the Danish ITI Center, President of the Interna- tional Festival Forum/IT and manager for several Danish theatres as well as producer for the two Danish festivals: Asteroid Festival and Waves Festival as well as the Nordic Performing Arts Days 14. Susanne has international expertise in creating festivals and in developing arts institutions, and has also been a consultant at the Danish Arts Foundation. She has been a member of IETM for many years. Susanne has a degree in Comparative Litterature and Modern Culture Studies from University of Copenhagen. She has studied at Shippenburgs University in USA and at Sorbonne in France, and has a diploma in Leadership. She is a certified Passion test Facilitatorand Flow Consultant in The Wealth Dynamic systems.





BIEL JORDÀ

Co-Director of the creation centre C.IN.E. Sineu / Mallorca

Graduate in Management and Playwriting by the Institut del Teatre Barcelona and BTEC in Performing Arts by The Circus Space School in London. He is the Co-Founder of the production company Res de Res Res i En Blanc SL, with which he directed or co-directed, among others, Ícars, Mara, Tempo, Setembre, Sine tierra, Pontes, (remor) and Fuga. He is the co-author and director of El ball de les balenes, Mira'm, La capsa de mu or Maria?, among others. He has also directed theatre plays for the companies ICT, Produccions del Mar, Discussions Productives and NUC. He has postgraduate studies in Performance Manage- ment by the School of Dramatic Art in the Balearic Islands (ESADIB), where he is currently professor of the Performance Workshop. He is now Co-Director of the C.IN.E., as well as of Circaire and Ciclop festivals.



IOANNA ELABD

Transformation Architect | Design Strategist & Innovation Facilitator / Greece

President of Domino Association / Croatia

Zvonimir Dobrovic is the President of Domino, which he founded in 2003 and that has since grown to be the biggest independent art organization in Croatia. He is responsible for curating and producing several festivals in Croatia and internationally, most notably Perforations-week of live art, Queer Zagreb Season, Queer New York International Art and Sounded Bodies festivals. Through different platforms, he curates over 100 performances annually staged around the world, many of them commissions and produced specifically for these and other festivals. He has served on numerous panels and boards, juries and committees in the field of performing arts. He has edited dozens of books and has as well worked as editor of several performing arts publications. He regularly holds lectures and workshops on curating and arts management.



PAVLOS KAVOURAS

Professor of the Faculty of Music Studies, School of Philosophy, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens Founder and Director of the Ethnomusicology and Cultural Anthropology Laboratory / Greece

Pavlos Kavouras is professor of the Faculty of Music Studies at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA). His scientific work blends anthropology and sociology, musicology, history, philosophy and cultural studies. He is Founder and Director of the Ethnomusicology and Cultural Anthropology Laboratory of the NKUA since its establishment in 2007. He has participated as principal or collaborating partner in many international projects related to lecturing, teaching and ethnographic research, as well as numerous other institutional synergies in art and education management. He has done extensive ethnographic research in Greece, the USA, Southwest India and Egypt. He has published numerous books and articles in English and in Greek, and is the General Editor of the Ethnomusicology and Anthropology scholarly series for Nissos Publications.

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
